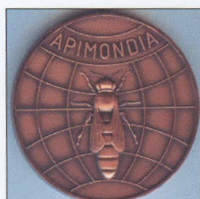

Front Cover: Willard Robinson's photograph shows an *Apis dorsata* worker in the clutches of a lynx spider (Oxyopidae: Peucetia sp.--probably *P. viridans*). The bee's stinger can be seen protruding. On the thorax of the bee is a kleptoparasitic fly (Chloropidae) associated with the spider and feeding from the wounds it inflicts on its prey.
